

Year Levels

Years 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6

Pre-Reading

Making Predictions:

- Predict what the story may be about by considering:
 - The title of the book
 - The cover
 - The illustrations

Making Connections:

- Identify the author/ illustrator of the book. Have you read any of his other books? Find some of his other books in your school or local library? How are they similar or different to *Ayu and the Perfect Moon*?
- Create a vision board in the classroom of images that you associate with Bali or Indonesia.
- Set-up a classroom library featuring fables and stories from other cultures.
- Use a graphic organiser of your choice to organise your knowledge and questions about the moon.

English

- What is your favourite part of this story? Explain your choice.
- 'In a village in Bali, an old woman told a story to three little girls.'
 - How does David Cox create the setting of Bali in his text and illustrations?
- What characteristics or features of Bali has the Story Box Library team used to create the background setting for this story segment?
- Use a Senses Chart to record how David Cox appeals to your senses to create vivid imagery throughout the story.
- 'When I was a little girl...'
 - What story do you think you will be telling when you are an adult about a part of your childhood? Write or tell a story about a meaningful event in your life.
- What oral-storytelling techniques does Old Ayu use as she tells her story?
- Use a Venn Diagram to show the similarities and differences between oral and written stories.
- Share with the class an oral story you have been told by a family member.
- Ria ends the story segment by saying 'Terima Kashih'.
 - Create an English- Indonesian dictionary of common phrases (e.g. hello, goodbye, sorry, excuse me, etc.)

Humanities and Social Sciences

- 'I liked to look at pictures of my mother when she was a little girl'
 - Source photos of your mother and use them to make a book titled, *A Book about My Mum*. Remember to interview your mum and annotate the photos.
- Plot the location of this story on a world map.
- Use the text and illustrations to create a list of physical and human characteristics of Bali.
 - How is the setting of this book similar or different to where you live? Use a graphic organiser to record your thoughts.
- Further research and create an infographic or interactive map on the physical geography (size, vegetation, climate etc.) and culture (dress, food, music, celebrations, traditions, rituals, beliefs, work, play) of Indonesia.
- Find out what influence and contribution Ria Soemardjo has made to Australian society and culture.
 - Undertake a personal inquiry into the influence or contribution of another Balinese-Australian.
- Research and describe how Australia and Indonesia have worked together in one of the following areas:
 - Tourism
 - Aid
 - Trade
 - Migration
- 'On the night of the full moon, people came from near and far.'
 - Find out what other celebrations, from around the world, coincide with phases of the moon.

Science

- 'One moonless night...'
 - Investigate whether a night can be moonless.
- 'Every night I looked at the moon.'
 - Keep a moon diary over the period of one month, recording, each night, your observations of the moon using drawings and written descriptions.
 - Watch an animation and create a demonstration of your own that shows the phases of the moon (e.g. phase wheel, flip book, moveable model)
 - Refer back to the illustrations in the book and name the moon phases in each of the illustrations
- 'On the night of the full moon, people came from near and far.'
 - Find out what natural events or phenomena are linked to the phases of the moon.

The Arts and Technologies

- What instruments are mentioned in this story segment? Experiment with playing and exploring these instruments.
- 'I danced the dance of the angry bird.'
- Use your body and face to portray a range of animals, and use these movements in a dance of your own.
- What colours has David used in his illustration?
 - How do they represent Bali/Indonesia/Asia?
 - What colours would you choose to represent Australia in illustration?
- Find and watch footage of the Legong Dance.
- Label a diagram or create an interactive image to describe the significance of a Balinese dance costume (e.g. colours, headdress etc.)
- Research and learn another type of Balinese dance. Then teach, demonstrate or show a clip of the steps to your classmates.
- Invite an Indonesian dance or drama group to perform at your school.


