

Themes: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories and Cultures, Colonial History, First Peoples, First Nations, NAIDOC, Courage and

bravery, Environment



Year levels: Upper primary

Discussion questions:

• Before reading the story, ask the students what they know about the terms 'rebel', 'hero' and 'innovators'?

After reading the story, discuss:

- What are some of the qualities and characteristics that helped these people achieve what they did?
- Which people in the story do you think were 'rebels', 'heroes' or 'innovators' or a combination of these terms?
- What did you notice about the structure of writing used to describe each persons story?
 Discuss how a narrative style of writing was used in the first part for each person, and a more factual style of writing was used in the second part. Why do you think the two different styles were used? How did the illustrations support these different styles of writing?
- How did British Settlers treat the people and communities in this book? What does it tell us about what was happening in Australia during this time?
- What can we learn from the people and their stories described in this book?

Story response ideas:

- Use a <u>Venn Diagram</u> to compare the experiences of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in this book with that of the life that British settlers experienced during these times.
 - What were the key differences?
 - What might some of the similarities be?
- Using a <u>T-Chart</u> make a note in each column of the key features of the two type of writing styles
 that were used to tell each persons story. Think about perspective, structure and the type of
 language used.

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
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Story response ideas continued...


- Use the **KWL Chart** to identify what you:
 - already knew about rebels, heroes and innovators in Australian history, before reading this book. Think about the known historical personalities that you are aware of and have learnt about, particularly those during colonial Australia.
 - have now learnt about certain Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander rebels, heroes and innovators from Australian history. Think about why their actions have been recognised in this book, and the types of qualities that may have helped them make an impact and a difference.
 - still wonder about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander rebels, heroes and innovators from Australian history. What would you like to find more out about?


